**Note from the Programme Chair:**

Welcome to the 48<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference of the Canadian Economics Association at the downtown Vancouver campus of Simon Fraser University. We have an outstanding program with over 200 sessions, including a number of Special Events, State-of-the-Art Lectures, Special Lectures and Panels. As of May 12, we had the highest number of paper submissions ever (1054 papers submitted), with 885 people registered, and at least 900 expected by the time the conference starts. This is a clear indication of the robust health of the economics profession in Canada.

As someone who has assiduously avoided administrative duties throughout my career, I was in more than a little dread as to the effort that I anticipated as program chair. But, thanks to the invaluable contributions of many people, my own input has been more or less limited to making the bold policy decisions about the program.

Je vous souhaite la bienvenue au 48<sup>e</sup> Congrès de l'Association canadienne d'économique (ACE) au campus de l'Université Simon Fraser situé au centre-ville de Vancouver. Le programme du congrès est exceptionnel : il compte plus de 200 séances, comprenant des événements spéciaux, des conférences État des connaissances, des conférences spéciales et des panels. Le 12 mai, le nombre de communications soumis (1054) a battu tous les records. Ce jour-là, il y avait 885 inscrits, avec au moins 900 attendus au début du congrès. Ceci constitue un indice clair de la santé robuste de la science économique au Canada.

Tout au long de ma carrière, je me suis efforcé d'éviter toute tâche d'ordre administratif, de sorte que je redoutais la charge associée à l'organisation du congrès. Mais, en l'occurrence, ma propre contribution s'est pratiquement limitée aux grands choix politiques. Ceci est dû aux efforts de plusieurs personnes, à qui je sais infiniment gré.


