## **Remembering Michael Trant**

Michael John Trant (January 14, 1950 – September 20, 2022)



The Canadian Agricultural Economics Society (CAES) and the agricultural economics profession were saddened to learn of the passing of Michael John Trant on Tuesday, September 20, 2022, at age 72. Mike passed away peacefully at home surrounded by his family.

Mike grew up in Toronto as the eldest of four children to Patrick and Eira Trant. He received his BA from Waterloo Lutheran (Wilfrid Laurier), where he met his wife of 51 years; then his MSc in Agricultural Economics from the University of Guelph in 1976, and moved to Ottawa shortly thereafter to begin his long career with Agriculture Canada and Statistics Canada.

He served as CAES president-elect in 2001/2002, CAES president in 2002/2003, Canadian Agricultural Economics and Farm Management Foundation president and on the CAES executive committee. Mike worked closely with many members of the CAES throughout his time at AAFC and Statistics Canada. Mike is described by close colleagues and friends as a consummate professional and humanitarian. His willingness to support his friends and colleagues at AAFC was greatly appreciated over the many years Mike worked at Statistics Canada. He is praised for always seeing data and statistics from the perspective of supporting policies and programs which was invaluable to economists at AAFC. One of his many contributions during this time was facilitating researchers affiliated with universities to come to Ottawa and access data that was traditionally not open access.



This data was instrumental to advancing research in the agricultural economics discipline. After retiring from the public service, Mike undertook work as part of a contract with FAO focusing on the World Census of Agriculture. His work on helping countries to re-establish sustainable agricultural practices following civil disruption, took him to countries including Indonesia, Mozambique, South Sudan, Morocco, and Italy. Much of this work was in Mozambique where he helped the National Statistics Institute set up a pilot survey for the 2010 Census. The CAES extends our sincere condolences to all those who had the privilege of knowing Mike.

Mike is survived by his devoted wife Airi, sons John (Dana) and Tim (Rachael), and four granddaughters (Alice, Quinn, Heidi, and Rosemary), as well as his siblings Moira, Jenny, and Fred. In lieu of flowers, donations can be made to the Ottawa Food Bank.
