

Dear Fellow economists,

It is a real pleasure for me to welcome you at the University of Quebec in Montreal (UQAM) for the 59th meeting of the Canadian Economics Association. Over 59 years, our discipline has rapidly evolved. Advances in econometrics and the modeling of heterogeneous and dynamic economies have significantly improved our ability to predict and measure the impact of public policies. Today, we can assert with infinitesimal doubt that one policy outperforms another in terms of the welfare of a given population. Economists have a substantial role to play in achieving societal well-being.

Constantly accelerating technological advances have allowed us to refine our tools even further. Artificial intelligence is already contributing to pushing these tools to new horizons.

These technological advances have also profoundly transformed society, making all published information easily accessible. The 21st century comes closest to being a knowledge society. Dear colleagues, make good use of it. Never hesitate to offer your expert insight in public debates. The sustainability of our free, democratic, and prosperous society depends on it.

Chères et chers collègues économistes,

Chères et chers collègues, faites-en bon usage. Ne rechignez jamais à offrir votre éclairage expert au débat public. Il en va de la pérennité de notre société libre, démocratique et prospère.
